James “Jim” Marcin is a professor of pediatrics and pediatric critical care at UC Davis Health, vice chair of pediatric clinical research and is director of the UC Davis Center for Health and Technology. Additionally, he serves as a clinician in the pediatric intensive care unit at UC Davis Children’s Hospital.

Marcin is a major professor in the Graduate Group in Epidemiology, a faculty member of the UC Davis Center for Health Services Research in Primary Care and a faculty member of the UC Davis Health Informatics Graduate Group. His expertise and research interests include pediatric critical care and emergency medicine telehealth, decision support, and quality of care measures.

With more than \$2 million in grant funding and research, Marcin is investigating the impact of telehealth on the quality of care delivered to acutely ill and injured children throughout Northern California, while simultaneously addressing access barriers and disparities in quality care delivered to critically ill children. He has presented his work on pediatric telehealth at several international conferences and is the co-chair of the only national Pediatric Telehealth Colloquium.

Marcin earned his doctor of medicine degree from the University of California, San Diego, completed his pediatrics residency at the University of California, San Francisco, and completed his pediatric critical care training at the Children’s National Medical Center in Washington, D.C. He holds a master’s degree in public health with an emphasis in biostatistics from George Washington University.
