FIRE PREVENTION OFFICE Holiday Decorations Guidelines

Decorations

- This document provides general guidance to ensure reasonable Fire and Life Safety compliance where conflict or questions arise. UC Davis Health Fire Marshals Office will make final determinations.
- Decorations must not obstruct exit doors, exit signs, or any other signs/equipment. (Fire extinguisher location signs and fire alarm audible/visual devices, for example).
- Decorations shall **not** be suspended from the ceiling, ceiling tiles, or ceiling fixtures including sprinkler heads or smoke detectors, as they constitute a fire hazard and violate the Joint Commission standards.
- Decorations including holiday cards, must **not** occupy an unsafe amount of wall area as
 determined by the UC Davis Health Fire Marshals Office. Special care and consideration
 must be given to un-sprinklered areas such as the Hospital North/South Wing which may be
 more restrictive.

Lights

- Decorative light sets must be UL-labeled, free of visible defects, and protected from mechanical damage while in use. The use of low-heat LED lights is recommended.
- Use of extension cords is strongly discouraged. However, if extension cords must be used, they must adhere to the UCDH P&P 1653, Electrical Equipment in Non-Patient Areas.
- All decorative lights should be unplugged when left unattended and at the close of each business day.

Artificial Trees

- Natural cut trees are **not allowed** in ANY UC Davis Health building.
- All artificial trees shall be certified flame-retardant and **ONLY** use UL-labeled lights.

Decoration Removal

Please remove all decorations no more than five (5) working days after the holiday.
