# 2025 Chair's Research Award Future Call

#### **GOALS**

To support investigators secure career development (K) and research (R) awards and transition into independent researchers. Applicants must have prior approval from their division chief. Preference will be given to candidates with a track record of actively applying for research grant opportunities.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Must be a resident, clinical fellow, or postdoctoral scholar in the Department of Internal Medicine pursing an academic career. Division chiefs along with residency and fellowship directors should help identify potential candidates. Our ideal candidate will participate in the Mentored Clinical Research Training Program (MCRTP) or other UCD training programs aiming to foster independent academic career. Awardee will participate as a member of the Department's Research Committee.

#### **FUNDING**

The department will fund one award in the amount of \$100,000/year for 2 years. Up to \$20,000/year may be used for materials and supplies. Funding may be used to for PI salary support only, salary for additional research personnel is not allowed.

#### CHAIR'S RESEARCH AWARD FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q1: Is a letter of intent from a division required to submit a full application?

No, a letter of intent is not required. The letters help us gauge the workload and identify potential reviewers.

Q2: Is the future call intended for residents or fellows in the last year of their training that plan to become faculty after graduation?

Yes, this call is intended to inform potential applicants to prepare for an upcoming deadline. The award targets current third-year residents or fellows, as well as postdocs and project scientists, who are interested in or being considered for a faculty position.
